

As a hotel employee, you are more than a staff member — you are an ambassador of both the hotel and Nicosia. Guests often form their first impression of the city through you.


Your enthusiasm, professionalism, and local knowledge can transform an ordinary stay into a truly special experience.

THE BRIGHTEST CAPITAL OF EUROPE

Nicosia is a city that will reward visitors in search of 'something different'. As a result of the various architectural influences that are visible throughout the city, one cannot help but be charmed by the manner in which past and present, traditional and contemporary have seamlessly fused together.

The modern city centre will capture your imagination from the start, with its melting pot of influences that give the city a unique image. The city's landmarks, museums, theatres, musical events and galleries both inspire and fascinate.

THE ADMINISTRATIVE CENTEROF CYPRUS

Most government services are located in Nicosia. From Ministries, Deputy Ministries, the Presidential Palace, the House of Representatives, the Central Bank of Cyprus, Embassies, Central Offices of State and semi-governmental organizations, all within short distance.

This is one of the most important reasons for Nicosia to become the center of conference tourism in Cyprus.

THE BUSINESS CENTER OF CYPRUS

Nicosia hosts a variety of businesses, ranging from big corporations, SMEs and start-ups. Prestigious organizations, such as the Cyprus Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI) and the Cyprus Investment Promotion Agency (CIPA) are in Nicosia.

In 2020, Nicosia has been named for the third consecutive year, as the top small European city of the future for human capital and lifestyle, according to the FDI magazine of Financial Times. The capital was also ranked among the top 10 small European cities of the future for foreign direct investment (FDI) strategy.

THE EDUCATIONAL CENTER OF CYPRUS

Nicosia hosts 29 universities and colleges in Cyprus, with more than 35.000 students and academicians from over 100 countries.

The academic community enriches the multicultural identity of the Nicosia. Academic excellence from various educational institutions offer hundreds of accredited courses with a vast variety of quality programs to choose from.

THE RESEARCH AND INNOVATION CENTER OF CYPRUS

Many of the research and innovation centres in Cyprus are in Nicosia, attracting the scientific community.

Cyprus Institute, CYENS (former Rise), FOSS, CyRIC, KIOS Research and Innovation Center of Excellence, University of Cyprus, IDEA Innovation Center and many other research centers putting Nicosia on the map and transforming city into an innovation hub and a startup city.







1. Rich History & Culture

Nicosia is the world's last divided capital, offering a fascinating blend of Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot heritage. Within its Venetian walls, you can explore:

- The Cyprus Museum (the island's largest archaeological museum).
- The Leventis Municipal Museum (perfect for learning the city's story).
- Traditional quarters like Laiki Geitonia, filled with restored 18th-century houses, artisan shops, and cobbled streets.



2. Authentic Urban Cypriot Life

As the island's capital, Nicosia gives you a genuine glimpse of modern Cypriot culture.

Enjoy:

- Local cafés and tavernas serving classic Cypriot coffee, meze, and sweets.
- Bustling markets and boutiques full of local crafts and design.
- A vibrant arts and nightlife scene, where traditional and modern Cyprus meet.



3.An Eventful and Energetic City

Nicosia is always alive with things to do — day and night.

- Festivals, concerts, and cultural events fill the calendar year-round.
- From open-air theatre in summer to art exhibitions and music nights, there's always something happening.
- The city's rooftop bars, galleries, and event spaces make it a hub for culture, entertainment, and community life.



Key Attractions:

Nicosia is full of character — a city where every corner tells a story. From ancient walls to trendy cafés, here are some must-see spots your guests will love:

Cyprus Museum – The island's top museum with fascinating ancient artifacts. A must for history lovers.

Leventis Municipal Museum - A fun, interactive look at Nicosia's past and present.

Byzantine Museum & Archbishop's Palace - Beautiful icons, art, and a taste of local religious history.

Famagusta Gate & Pafos Gate - One of the famous Venetian gates and a popular photo stop.

Laiki Geitonia - Cobbled streets, cozy tavernas, local crafts, and classic architecture.

Faneromeni Square - The heart of the old city; great for people-watching and coffee breaks.

Ledra & Onasagorou Streets - Bustling shopping and dining spots full of local energy.

Ermou Street - A lively street filled with boutiques, creative spaces, and great cafés — a favorite among locals.







Key Attractions:

Shacolas Tower Observatory - Panoramic city views and a great photo opportunity.

Nicosia Municipal Gardens - A peaceful green escape in the city center.

Cultural venues & galleries - Check out the Nicosia Municipal Theatre and NiMAC (Nicosia Municipal Arts Centre) for concerts, exhibitions, and events.

House of Hatzigeorgakis Kornesios - A beautifully preserved 18th-century mansion that shows how the city's nobility once lived.

Bank of Cyprus Cultural Foundation – Stunning exhibitions of Cypriot art, coins, and history in the heart of the old town.

Fairytale Museum – A whimsical museum celebrating storytelling and imagination — perfect for families and the young at heart.

Eleftheria Monument - A powerful national symbol honoring Cyprus's struggle for freedom.

Eleftheria Square & the New Municipality Building – A striking modern redesign by architect Zaha Hadid — a symbol of Nicosia's renewal and creativity.

Classic Motorcycle Museum - A hidden treasure showcasing vintage motorcycles and Cypriot motoring history — a real favorite among enthusiasts!



EVENTS GUIDE

- Monthly Updates featuring detailed information about the events happening that month in Nicosia, including dates, venues, and ticket details.



Employees are encouraged to check this site frequently and note key events that guests may find interesting.

Reception and concierge staff should be especially familiar with what is happening during the current and upcoming weeks so they can confidently answer questions such as:

- "Are there any concerts or shows this weekend?"
- "What festivals are taking place in the city this month?" "Is there a local food or art event we can visit tonight?"



 Vineyard Delights & Drinkery Discoveries - Local wineries, wine bars, and cocktail spots showcasing the island's finest blends.

 Café Culture & Brunch Bliss - Stylish coffee shops and brunch places perfect for a relaxed city morning.

 Sweet Tradition - Handmade desserts, spoon sweets, and traditional pastries found in the city's bakeries.

 Vegan & Vegetarian – Innovative plant-based cuisine that reflects Nicosia's modern culinary identity.

 Multi-Culti - Global flavours and international dining for those who love variety.

Xmas Tip:

Encourage guests to explore both the main city festivities and nearby village experiences. Recommend evening visits for the best atmosphere and highlight local seasonal specialties such as zivanomelo (warm zivania with honey), melomakarona, and kourabiedes for an authentic taste of Cypriot Christmas.

GETTING AROUND NICOSIA

Nicosia is easy to explore thanks to its compact layout and well-connected transport options. Guests can move around comfortably by bus, taxi, car, bicycle, or on foot.

Public Transport

- The Nicosia Bus Network links the city centre with surrounding areas and other towns in Cyprus.
- Buses are affordable and air-conditioned; tickets are available on board or via the Cyprus Public Transport app.

Taxis

- Taxis operate 24/7 and can be hailed, booked by phone, or ordered through taxi apps.
- Recommended for airport transfers or short city trips.

Car Hire

- Ideal for guests wishing to explore beyond the city.
- Remind visitors that driving in Cyprus is on the left-hand side.

Cycling & Walking

- The Nextbike system offers easy bike rentals for short trips.
- The walled city and old town are best explored on foot to enjoy their history and atmosphere.

Airport Transfers


- Express shuttle buses connect Nicosia with Larnaca and Paphos Airports several times daily.
- The trip from Larnaca Airport takes about 45 minutes.


















Ngage is an initiative by Visit Nicosia that celebrates the city's vibrant cultural identity — from ancient history and traditional crafts to contemporary art and creativity.
